



# Fall Home Maintenance Checklist

As leaves start to fall and temperatures drop, now's the time to give your home a little extra care. Here's a complete fall checklist — including some often-overlooked tasks that can help prevent damage and keep your home running efficiently all season long.

# **Outdoor Prep**

- Clean gutters and downspouts: Remove leaves and debris so water can flow freely and prevent ice dams later.
- Inspect your roof: Look for missing or damaged shingles and check flashing around chimneys and vents.
- Trim trees and shrubs: Cut back branches that hang near your home or power lines to prevent storm damage.
- Drain and store garden hoses: Shut off outdoor water valves and drain spigots to avoid frozen pipes.
- Check walkways and driveways: Repair cracks now before freezing temps cause them to expand.
- Seal gaps and openings: Inspect the foundation, siding, and windows for entry points that let in cold air (or critters!).

## **Indoor Safety**

- Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors: Replace batteries and confirm they're working properly.
- Inspect your fireplace and chimney: Have them professionally cleaned before the first fire of the season.
- Clean out your dryer vent: Lint buildup is one of the most common causes of house fires and an easy one to prevent.

- Schedule a furnace tune-up: Regular maintenance improves efficiency and prevents mid-winter breakdowns.
- Replace air filters: Clean filters keep your HVAC system running smoothly and your air cleaner.
- Check space heaters: Ensure cords are in good condition and keep them at least 3 feet away from anything flammable.

### **Plumbing & Utilities**

- **Drain your water heater:** Flushing it helps remove sediment buildup that reduces efficiency and shortens its lifespan.
- Insulate exposed pipes: Especially those in unheated areas like basements, garages, or crawl spaces.
- Check sump pump operation: Pour water into the pit to make sure it cycles properly before the wet winter months.

#### **Out-of-the-Box Essentials**

- Reverse ceiling fans: Switch blades to spin clockwise to push warm air down during colder months.
- Inspect attic insulation: Look for gaps, wet spots, or signs of pests before winter sets in.
- Clean refrigerator coils: Helps your fridge run efficiently and saves energy.
- Test GFCI outlets: Press the "test" and "reset" buttons to ensure safety around moisture-prone areas.
- Check for drafts with a candle or incense stick: A simple way to spot leaky windows or doors that need weatherstripping.
